Affidavit of Smoke Alarm and Carbon Monoxide Alarm Installation

California state law requires verification of proper installation of smoke and carbon monoxide alarms whenever a building permit is obtained for any alteration on a residential property. This form enables the property owner to self-certify that the requirement for these alarms have been met when the building is inspected by the fire department during annual or state mandated inspections. Fire Inspectors will not enter private residential units/spaces of a larger building or complex. Smoke and carbon monoxide detectors in common areas, business offices, laundry rooms, maintenance rooms, club houses or similar spaces, will be tested by the fire department.

MODEL REQUIREMENTS

- ☐ Smoke and carbon monoxide arms must be approved and listed by the State Fire Marshal, found at http://osfm.fire.ca.gov/licensinglistings/licenselisting_bml_searchcotest
- ☐ The devices must be installed according to the manufacturer's instructions.

INSTRUCTIONS: The OWNER or PROPERTY MANAGEMENT must complete and sign this affidavit. An electronic copy can be emailed to your inspector. This form is required to complete the inspection.

Outside of each separate dwelling unit sleeping area in the immediate vicinity of the bedroom/s. 2. On every level of a dwelling unit, including basements.
